ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE MAINTENANCE SITE

1. Blue **BAGGED** co-mingled recyclables/glass, plastic (numbers one (1) through seven (7), aluminum, steel containers (containers must be rinsed and caps removed)
2. Branches or brush
3. Clear **BAGGED** household garbage. Garbage must be bagged – no loose garbage will be received
4. **BUNDLED** newspapers – not in plastic bags
5. **BUNDLED** magazines – not in plastic bags
6. **BUNDLED** chipboard – not in plastic bags
7. **FLATTENED** cardboard
8. Grass clippings and leaves – **UNBAGGED**
9. Small amounts of wood and lumber – clean, untreated wood only, that is able to be chipped
10. Ranges, water heaters and other **METAL**
11. Tires (**\$3.00 per car tire / \$6.00 per truck tire / \$10.00 per tractor tire will be charged**)
12. Waste or drain oil in no larger than 2-gallon containers

***** GARBAGE MUST BE BAGGED *** NEWSPAPERS & MAGAZINES MUST BE BUNDLED *****
***** CARDBOARD MUST BE FLATTENED *****

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED AT THE MAINTENANCE SITE

1. Aerosols, acids and bases, paint and related products
2. Air conditioners
3. Dehumidifiers, refrigerators, freezers
4. Batteries and fluorescent light bulbs
5. Bushes and tree stumps
6. Carpeting and carpet padding
7. Computers, hard-drives and monitors
8. Concrete, demolition materials from remodeling projects
9. Dishwashers
10. Razing, construction, renovation materials
11. Household hazardous waste, lawn and garden pesticides
12. Household furniture
13. Indoor or outdoor furniture
14. Large amounts of wood and/or lumber from remodeling projects, treated, painted wood of any kind
15. Mattresses, box springs, furniture, rugs, carpeting, padding
16. Microwaves
17. Old gasoline or gas cans
18. Poisons, solvents and cleaners, thinners and varnishes
19. Refuse from commercial and/or industrial sites
20. Televisions
21. Toilets, sinks, tubs, washbasins

If you are unsure about what is accepted and not accepted, please check before you bring the item.

“HOW TO” RECYCLE SHEET

PLACE THESE ITEMS MIXED TOGETHER IN A BLUE RECYCLING BAG

MATERIALS TO BE COMMINGLED	WHAT DO I RECYCLE?	CLEANING & PREPARATION	WHAT CAN'T BE RECYCLED?
Glass	Bottles and jars ONLY Green, clear & brown	Remove lids and discard in trash <i>RINSE CLEAN</i> <i>REMOVE RINGS</i>	Windows and mirrors Light bulbs and tubes Pyrex and dishes, drinking glasses, chemical bottles, medical containers, laboratory glass
Aluminum	Cans and foil, bottle caps	<i>RINSE CLEAN</i> Flattening optional	Contaminated foil
Tin and steel cans	All empty cans, All aerosol cans that are punctured	<i>RINSE CLEAN</i> Flattening optional, Puncture aerosol cans	Cardboard sided juice containers, aerosol cans and paint cans with product not emptied
Plastic	Milk, yogurt, soda and detergent bottles, other bottles marked #1 through #7	<i>RINSE CLEAN</i> Remove and discard lids in trash, crush bottles	Plastic oil bottles, ice cream containers, food containers, Styrofoam, plastic cups and film, hard plastic toys (toys, pails, etc.) Medicine bottles & syringes

OTHER RECYCLABLE ITEMS NOT IN A BLUE RECYCLING BAG

MATERIALS	WHAT DO I RECYCLE?	CLEANING & PREPARATION	WHAT CAN'T BE RECYCLED?
Newspapers Junk mail Magazines	Newspapers Junk mail Magazines	Tie with a string or twine in both directions or place in grocery bag. Bundles no larger than 8" high.	Wax coated paper
Cardboard	All cardboard boxes	Flatten boxes Cut into 3 x 3 pieces Tie in bundles	Cardboard sided juice containers and oil contaminated cardboard
